Title Nizāmī Ganjavī, Khamsah

Content The five poems making up the *Khamsah* by Niẓāmī Ganjavī (1140 or 41-1202 or 3),

containing 19 whole-page miniatures, one ( $\frac{f}{41r}$ ) thought to date from the mid-15th century; 14 in the Herat later-Timurid style; and four (ff  $\frac{234v}{245v}$ ,  $\frac{250v}{250v}$  and  $\frac{271v}{250v}$ ) are Tabriz/Safavid work c. 1535-40. Three paintings (ff.  $\frac{121v}{161r}$  and  $\frac{231v}{250v}$ ) are

attributed to Bihzad.

(3v) A prince and his retinue being entertained at night in a garden.

(4r) Preparations for a banquet.

Khusraw u Shīrīn

Illustrations:

(77v) A servant laying a carpet before Khusraw's horse as he arrives at Shīrīn's castle. Inscription dated Rajab 895/1490 (not 898 as stated in Titley,1977).

(130v) Majnūn with animals in the desert.

Haft paykar

Illustrations:

(161r) Bahrām Gūr kills the dragon. Ascribed to Bihzād in margin between verses.

(173r) Bahrām Gūr with the Indian Princess in the Black Pavilion.

(188r) Māhān confronted by  $d\bar{\imath}vs$  finds his horse transformed into a seven-headed dragon (story told by the Princess of Khvarazm).

Illustrations:

(231v) Battle between Iskandar and Dārā. Ascribed to Bihzād in margin between verses.

(234v) Iskandar comforts the dying Dārā.

(245v) Nūshābah recognises Iskandar from his portrait. Inscription.

(250v) Iskandar visiting the hermit.

(271v) Iskandar lassoing Kintāl, the Russian champion.
